Information about Digla Protected Area

- There are two main types of wastes, solid and liquid wastes. These wastes disrupt the environment around us.
- Activities such as waste disposal without regulation may cause a serious disturbance to ecosystems and expose the animals to danger.
- The protectorate is beautiful place where wildlife is safe.
- Wadi Digla is an example of Egypt's Protected Areas exposed to waste disposal.
- There are many animals in Wadi Digla such as spiny mice, red foxes, gazelles and bats that live in the caves in the protectorate.

What can I do?

- Dispose of garbage in its designated places in the Protected Area. Stick to tracks designed for walks and don't bring pets such as dogs or cats unless you have permission.
- Keep school, home, club and street clean. Try as much as possible to collect up plastic bags.
- Take part in the volunteer activities arranged by the Protectorate for cleaning and maintaining wildlife.
- Talk to your friends about how garbage can damage wildlife.


