


My friends, please, don't buy me from markets. You should tell the police about anyone who sells or collects us, because this is against the law.

#### Extra Information

- The Egyptian tortoise is one of the smallest tortoises in the world.
- A male reaches 8 to 10 cm long, while females are about 10 to 12 cm.
- The tortoise occurs on the Mediterranean coastal range.
- The average lifespan of a tortoise is 50 years.
- It is very slow. It is active during the night, and hides in the sand in the morning.
- · It feeds on weeds, desert plants and fruits.
- · A tortoise becomes adult between the ages of 14 and 20.
- A female lays about 5 eggs in a hole in the sand under a bush or a burrow. Eggs hatch to give little tortoises.
- · It is about to become extinct in Egypt.

### The aim of the story:

- · Trade in wild animals is a reason behind the loss of tortoises.
- · Most captive tortoises are illegally sold in pet shops.
- A huge number of animals die even before reaching the pet shops; the loss may reach 90%.
- Selling tortoises and keeping them as pets is against International and Egyptian law.

#### What can I do?

- 1.Don't buy any that are offered to you, or keep them indoors.
- 2.If you own one, you should hand it to the Omayed Protected Area rangers in Matrouh. There it will receive the best care, and it will be released back to its natural habitat.


